This Month in Irish History

- December 1, 1946 Singer Gilbert (Richard) O'Sullivan is born in Waterford.
- December 3, 1792 Beginning on this date and continuing through December 8, a Catholic Convention is held in Tailors' Hall, Dublin to demand abolition of the remaining penal laws; a petition is presented to the king in London.
- .December 6, 1921 Signing of the Anglo-Irish Treaty creating the Free State.
- December 6th In the liturgical calendar, today is the feast of St. Nicholas.
- December 7, 521 –Birth of Saint Columcille, Irish bard and monk, honored in all the Celtic lands.
- December 8, 1831 Death of James Hoban, the Kilkenny architect who designed the White House. He also designed the state capital in Columbia, South Carolina.
- December 9, 1995 Seamus Heaney Wins Nobel Prize for Literature.
- December 13, 1862 the Irish Brigade of the Army of the Potomac suffered horrendous casualties during the Battle of Fredericksburg.
- December 1653 Oliver Cromwell becomes Lord Protector of Ireland.
- December 20, 1891 Annie Moore left Queenstown, Cork , Ireland today for Ellis Island.
- December 21, 1919 Dáil Éireann meets for the first time and elects Eamon de Valera as President of Ireland.
- December 22, 1989 -Death of Samuel Beckett.

This Month in Irish History

- December 23, 1688- English King James II flees to France and William of Orange seizes the throne of England.
- December 24, 1601 The Battle of Kinsale. . Hugh O'Neill and Red Hugh O'Donnell are heavily defeated by Mountjoy.
- December 26th In the liturgical calendar, today is the feast of St. Stephen.
- December 27, 1904 Abbey Theatre founded in Dublin.
- December 29, 1829 Fr. John B. Bannon, Confederate Army Chaplain, is born in Co. Leitrim.
- December 31, 1602. The O'Sullivan Beara's are driven out of West Cork by the English who had defeated the combined Spanish and Irish forces at the Battle of Kinsale. Dónal Cam O'Sullivan, chieftain of the clan, begins the long march to Leitrim on this date, where he hopes to gain sanctuary with the O'Rourke's of Breffni. Accompanying him are 1,000 men, women and children representing the first large-scale exodus of people from the Castletownbere region. From West Cork to Leitrim is 260 miles.

down, but I do believe that the Irish community nationwide will support a project that focuses on the achievements of the Irish of America. The 150th anniversary of the death of Thomas Meagher takes place next year so it's appropriate to feature his life with a special emphasis on his time in Montana; a film on Marcus Daly, nationalist and industrialist, is long overdue; and O Sullivan represents a cultural movement that originated in America and began the revolution, as Padraig Pearse said, that would achieve independence. It's also worth noting that he was a member of the AOH all his life, so brothers may be interested in supporting a film that recognizes one of their own.

Once these documentaries are made, they will be broadcast on PBS and on Irish national television. We will also place a copy of each in every high school in Montana, and will offer scholarships to students to study Irish culture at UM for essays, poems and short stories inspired by the films. It's an ambitious plan, but we need to be creative and ambitious if we are going to educate and encourage the next generation to study the history and culture of the Irish.
