### **This Month in Irish History**

- May 1, 1170 Arrival of Normans in Co. Wexford. Arrival of Richard de Clare, Earl of Pembroke, subsequently known as 'Strongbow'.
- May 1, 1697 The Bishops' Banishment Act passed on 25
  September 1696, requires most Catholic
  clergy to leave the kingdom by this date, and
  bans Catholic clergy from entering it the Act
  will never be efficiently enforced.
- May 1, 1794 Catholics are enabled by law to attend Trinity College.
- May 3, 1916 at 6:00 pm Grace Gifford entered Kimainham
  Gaol. At 11:30pm she walked into the prison
  chapel where Joseph Plunkett waited for her
  at the altar with a priest and two witnesses
  from the Third Battalion of the Royal Irish
  Regiment. During the ceremony the couple
  was not allowed to talk to each other except to
  recite the words of the ceremony. Immediately
  after the ceremony, Joseph was brought back
  to his cell and Grace left.
- May 3, 1916 Pádraig Pearse, Thomas Clarke, and Thomas MacDonagh executed at Kilmainhan Gaol
- May 12, 1916- Seán Mac Diarmada and James Connolly executed at Kilmainhan Gaol
- May 15, 1847 The first coffin ship "The Syria" arrives at Grosse Isle.
- May 15, 1847 Daniel O'Connell, "The Liberator," dies in Genoa
- May 17, 1650 Cromwell's army is defeated in the second assault on Clonmel, suffering its heaviest losses.

Greetings to all,


